SUPPRESSION CAN OCCUR IF THERE ARE FEWER THAN 15 PERSONS IN A GEOGRAPHIC AREA, FEWER THAN 15 PERSONS IN A RACIAL CATEGORY, FEWER THAN 5 HOUSEHOLDS IN A RACIAL CATEGORY. ACCORDING TO THE CENSUS BUREAU, THIS PLACE HAD A TOTAL OF 2234 RESIDENTS IN 1980. THE DATA IN THIS REPORT ARE BASED ON A SAMPLE OF 1057 OF THE RESIDENTS OF THIS PLACE. THESE PEOPLE COMPLETED THE "LONG FORM" OF THE CENSUS QUESTIONNAIRE. IN INCORPORATED PLACES WITH AT LEAST 2,500 INHABITANTS, EVERY SIXTH HOUSEHOLD RECEIVED THE LONG QUESTIONNAIRE. IN RURAL AREAS AND INCORPORATED PLACES WITH FEWER THAN 2,500 INHABITANTS, ONE OF EVERY TWO HOUSEHOLDS RECEIVED THE LONG FORM. THE BUREAU OF THE CENSUS THEN USED A COMPLEX PROCEDURE TO WEIGHT THE SAMPLE DATA SO THAT THEY REPORTS ALL RESIDENTS OF THIS PLACE. 1052 THEY REPRESENT ALL RESIDENTS OF THIS PLACE.

FOR DEFINITIONS OF TERMS USED IN THIS REPORT, PLEASE REFER TO INTRODUCTIONS AND APPENDICES OF HOUSING REPORTS OF THE BUREAU OF THE CENSUS. A FEW ADDITIONAL COMMENTS ARE NOTED AT THE END OF THIS REPORT.

ACCORDING TO THE CENSUS BUREAU, THIS PLACE HAD A TOTAL OF 909 HOUSING UNITS IN 1980. THE DATA IN THIS REPORT ARE BASED ON A SAMPLE OF 445 OF THE HOUSING UNITS. PEOPLE IN THESE UNITS COMPLETED THE "LONG FORM" OF THE HOUSING UNITS. PEUPLE IN THESE UNITS COMPLETED THE "LUNG FORM" OF THE CENSUS QUESTIONNAIRE. IN INCORPORATED PLACES WITH 2,500 DR MORE INHABITANTS, EVERY SIXTH HOUSEHOLD RECEIVED THE LONG QUESTIGNNAIRE. IN RURAL AREAS AND INCORPORATED PLACES WITH FEWER THAN 2,500 INHABITANTS, ONE OF EVERY TWO HOUSEHOLDS RECEIVED THE LONG FORM. THE BUREAU OF THE CENSUS THEN USED A COMPLEX PROCEDURE TO WEIGHT THE SAMPLE DATA SO THAT THEY REPRESENT ALL HOUSING UNITS AND RESIDENTS OF THIS PLACE.
