IN ORDER TO MAINTAIN CONFIDENTIALITY AS REQUIRED BY LAW, IT IS NECESSARY FOR THE CENSUS BUREAU TO MAKE SURE THAT ITS PUBLIC DATA CO NOT DISCLOSE INFORMATION ABOUT ANY INDIVIDUAL. THE BUREAU SUPPRESSES TABULATIONS OF CHARACTERISTICS OF VERY SMALL GROUPS OF PEOPLE OR HOUSING UNITS. SUPPRESSION CAN OCCUR IF THERE ARE FEWER THAN 15 PERSONS IN A GEOGRAPHIC AREA, FEWER THAN 15 PERSONS IN A RACIAL CATEGORY, FEWER THAN 5 HOUSEHOLDS IN A RACIAL CATEGORY, OR FEWER THAN 5 UNITS IN A HOUSING CATEGORY. SEVERAL TABLES OF BASIC COUNTS ARE NEVER SUPPRESSED. AN ASTERISK (*) AFTER A TABLE NAME INDICATES THAT SUPPRESSION MAY HAVE OCCURRED IN THAT TABLE.

ACCORDING TO THE CENSUS BUREAU, THIS PLACE HAD A TOTAL OF 1209 RESIDENTS IN 1980. THE DATA IN THIS REPORT ARE BASED ON A SAMPLE OF 59 OF THE RESIDENTS OF THIS PLACE. THESE PEOPLE COMPLETED THE "LONG FORM" OF THE CENSUS QUESTIONNAIRE. IN INCORPORATED PLACES WITH AT LEAST 2,500 INHABITANTS, EVERY SIXTH HOUSEHOLD RECEIVED THE LONG QUESTIONNAIRE. IN RURAL AREAS AND INCORPORATED PLACES WITH FEWER THAN 2,500 INHABITANTS, ONE OF EVERY TWO HOUSEHOLDS RECEIVED THE LONG FORM. THE BUREAU OF THE CENSUS THEN USED A COMPLEX PROCEDURE TO WEIGHT THE SAMPLE DATA SO THAT THEY REPRESENT ALL RESIDENTS OF THIS PLACE. 593

(1) IN ORDER TO MAINTAIN CONFIDENTIALITY AS REQUIRED BY LAW, IT IS NECESSARY FOR THE CENSUS BUREAU TO MAKE SURE THAT ITS PUBLIC DATA DO NOT DISCLOSE INFORMATION ABOUT ANY INDIVIDUAL. THE BUREAU SUPPRESSES TABULATIONS OF CHARACTERISTICS OF VERY SMALL GROUPS OF PEOPLE OR HOUSING UNITS. (2) THIS AND OTHER AGGREGATES, ALONG WITH THE RELEVANT COUNTS, PERMIT THE COMPUTATION OF MEANS. FOR EXAMPLE, THE AGGREGATED INCOME FOR UNRELATED INDIVIDUALS DIVIDED BY THE NUMBER OF UNRELATED INDIVIDUALS REPORTING THEIR INCOMES YIELDS THE MEAN INCOME FOR UNRELATED INDIVIDUALS.

(3) AGIAN AND PACIFIC ISLANDER INCLUDES JAPANESE, CHINESE, FILIPINO, KOREAN, ASIAN AND PACIFIC ISLANDER, VIETNAMESE, HAWAIIAN, GUAMANIAN, SAMDAN, AND THOSE PERSONS WHO HAVE A WRITE-IN ENTRY OF AN ASIAN OR PACIFIC ISLANDER GROUP IN THE "OTHER" CATEGORY.

(4) HOUSEHOLDS MAY BE COUNTED MORE THAN ONCE IN THIS TABULATION.

(5) TABULATIONS OF POVERTY STATUS EXCLUDE INMATES OF INSTITUTIONS, MEMBERS OF THE ARMED FORCES LIVING IN BARRACKS, COLLEGE STUDENTS LIVING IN DORMITORIES, AND UNRELATED INDIVIDUALS UNDER 15 YEARS.

(6) PERSONS MAY BE COUNTED MORE THAN ONCE IN THIS TABULATION.

(7) THE FARM POPULATION IS DEFINED AS PERSONS LIVING IN RURAL TERRITORY ON PLACES FROM WHICH \$1,000 OR MORE OF FARM PRODUCTS WERE SOLD IN 1979.

(8) IN 1970, THE DEFINITION OF FARM INCLUDED ALL PLACES WITH SALES OF \$250 OR MORE, PLUS RURAL PLACES OF 10 OR MORE ACRES WITH SALES OF \$50 TO \$249.
