-The Census Bureau introduced a new skip pattern for the disability questions in the 2003 ACS questionnaire. Accordingly, comparisons of data from 2003 or later with data from prior years are not recommended for the relevant questions. For more information, see the ACS Subject Definitions for Disability.
