THE BUREAU SUPPRESSES TABULATIONS OF CHARACTERISTICS OF VERY SMALL GROUPS OF PEOPLE OR HOUSING UNITS. SUPPRESSION CAN OCCUR IF THERE ARE FEWER THAN 15 PERSONS IN A GEOGRAPHIC AREA, FEWER THAN 15 PERSONS IN A RACIAL CATEGORY, FEWER THAN 5 HOUSEHOLDS IN A RACIAL CATEGORY, OR FEWER THAN 5 UNITS IN A HOUSING CATEGORY.
