The first American Indian Day was celebrated in May 1916 in New York. In 1990, President George H.W. Bush signed a joint congressional resolution designating November 1990 as "National American Indian Heritage Month." Similar proclamations have been issued every year since 1994.

The estimated number of Native Americans and Alaska Natives in Iowa in 2017. The U.S. Census Bureau estimates a 80.5% increase in population between 2000 and 2017.

14,199

The projected Native American non Hispanic population of Iowa in 2050. According to Woods & Poole Economics Inc., Native Americans will constitute 0.4 percent of the states total population on that date.

Population in the Sac and Fox/Meskwaki American Indian Area according to the 2012-2016 American Community Survey

Families and Children

2,136

The number of American Indian and Alaska native families in 2017 who reside in Iowa.

23.4%

Percentage of American Indian and Alaska Native married-couple families with related children under 18 years of age in 2017. This compares to 31.7% for the state of Iowa.

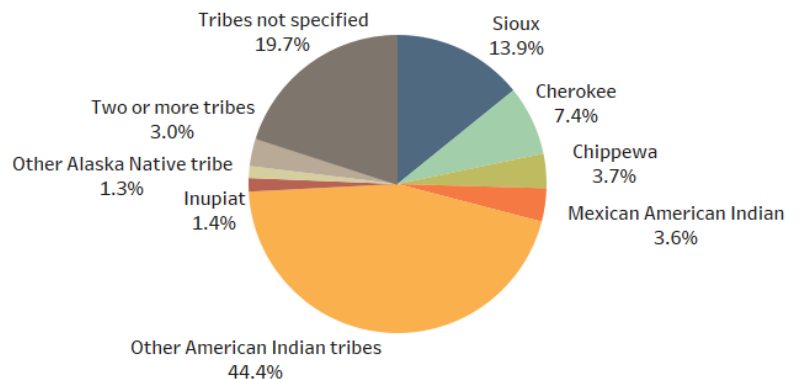
Percentage of American Indian and Alaska Native population under age 5 in 2017. This compares to 6.3 percent for the state of Iowa.

Number of Iowa American Indian and Alaska Natives 25 years and older with an advanced degree in 2017. (e.g., master's, professional, doctorate.)

The number of Iowa American Indian and Alaska Native veterans of the U.S. armed forces in 2017.

Migration

51.6%

The percentage of American Indians and Alaska Natives in 2017 who were born in Iowa. This compares to 70.2% of the total population in Iowa who were born in the state.

77.6%

The percentage of American Indians and Alaska Natives in 2017 who lived in the same house last year. For the entire state of Iowa, that percentage was 85.4%.

Housing

37.0%

The percentage in Iowa of households with a householder who is American Indian and Alaska Native in Iowa who own their home in 2017. This compares with 71.6% for the state of Iowa.

62.5%

The percentage of American Indians and Alaska Natives in 2017 who live in an urban area. This compares with 64.5% for the state of Iowa.

The percent of the Iowa American Indian and Alaska Native population with no health insurance coverage in 2017. The corresponding rate for all Iowa is 4.7%

The per capita income of Iowa American Indian and Alaska Natives in 2017. The per capita income for the state was \$30,865.

24.1%

The poverty rate for the Iowa American Indian and Alaska Native population in 2017. The corresponding rate for Iowa is 10.7%

Counties and cities

2,847

The number of American Indian and Alaska Natives in Woodbury County in 2017, making it largest population of American Indian and Alaska Natives in any Iowa county.

37.4%

Over one third of the total American Indian and Alaska Native population live in Woodbury, Polk and Tama counties.

1,373

The number of American Indian and Alaska Natives in Sioux City making it largest population of American Indian and Alaska Natives in any city in Iowa.

51.1%

Over one-half of the growth in Iowa's Native American population from 2000-2017 occurred in nine counties: Black Hawk, Dallas, Johnson, Marshall, Plymouth, Polk, Pottawattamie, Tama, and Woodbury.

8.3%

The percent of total population in Tama County who are American Indian and Alaska Natives in 2017. The next county with high percentages of American Indian and Alaska Natives is Woodbury with 2.8%.

35.4%

The percentage of Iowa's total American Indian and Alaska Natives population living in 6 cities: Sioux City, Des Moines, Davenport, Cedar Rapids, Waterloo, and Council Bluffs.
