

ASIAN/PACIFIC AMERICANS IN IOWA: 2018

MAY 2018

In 1978, a joint congressional resolution established Asian/Pacific American Heritage Week. The first 10 days of May were chosen to coincide with two important anniversaries: the arrival in the United States of the first Japanese immigrants (May 7, 1843) and the completion of the transcontinental railroad (May 10, 1869). In 1992, Congress expanded the 10-day observance to a month-long celebration.

The number of Iowa residents in 2016 who say they are Asian. This group comprises 2.5 percent of Iowa's total population.

114.9%

The percent change in the Asian population from 2000 to 2016. This is a 42,100 numeric increase for the period.

131,434

The projected number of Iowa residents who will identify themselves as either Asian or native Hawaiian and other Pacific Islander in 2050 according to Woods & Poole Economics, Inc.

3,592

The number Iowa residents who say they are native Hawaiian and other Pacific Islander alone or in combination with one or more races in 2016. This group comprises 0.1% of Iowa's total population.

256%

The percent change in population for native Hawaiian and other Pacific Islanders alone from 2000 to 2016. This is a numeric increase of 2,583 for the period.

36.2%

The percent of Iowa's foreign born population in 2016 who were born in Asia.

80.6%

The percentage of Iowa's Asian foreign-born who entered the United States since 1990.

41.7%

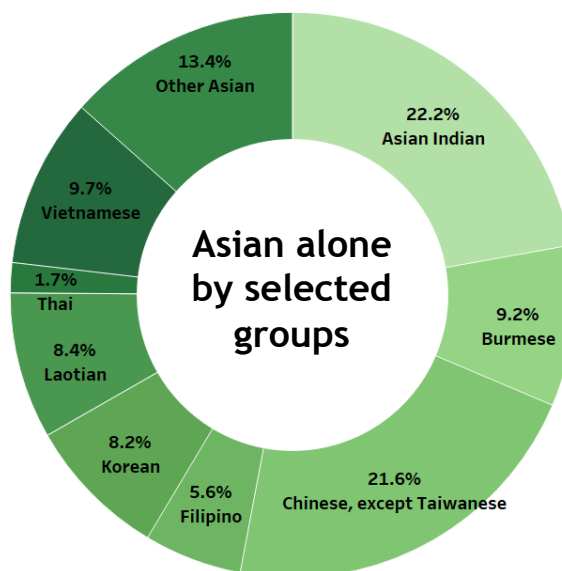
The percentage of Iowa's foreign-born in 2016 from Asia who are naturalized citizens. The corresponding rate for the Iowa foreign-born population as a whole is 38.7 percent.

11,308

The estimated number of foreign-born people from India in 2016. After Mexico, India is the second leading country of birth for the state's foreign-born. Also among the top 10 countries of birth for Iowa's foreign-born population are China (10,611), Burma (5,233), Korea (5,224), Vietnam (5,131), and the Philippines (4,371).

The average family size for those who reported their race as Asian. The average family size in the state of Iowa is 2.99.

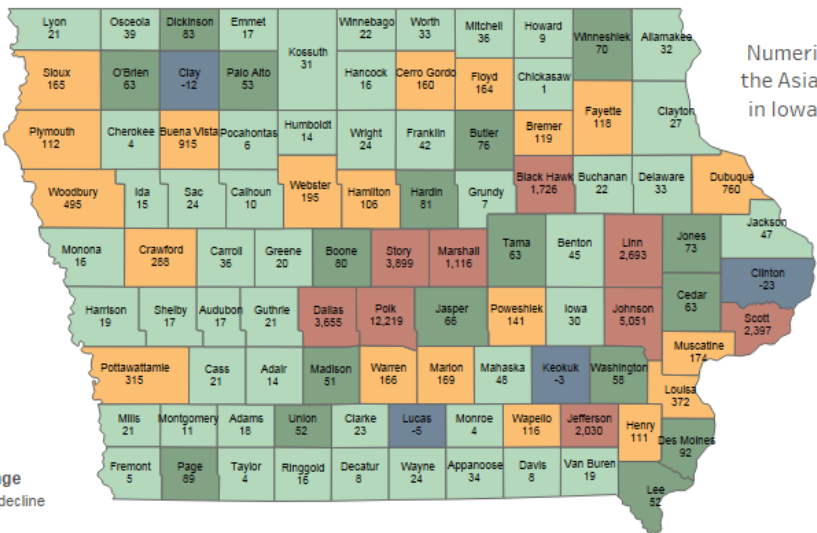

Jefferson county is where Asians make up the highest proportion of the total population (12.7 percent).

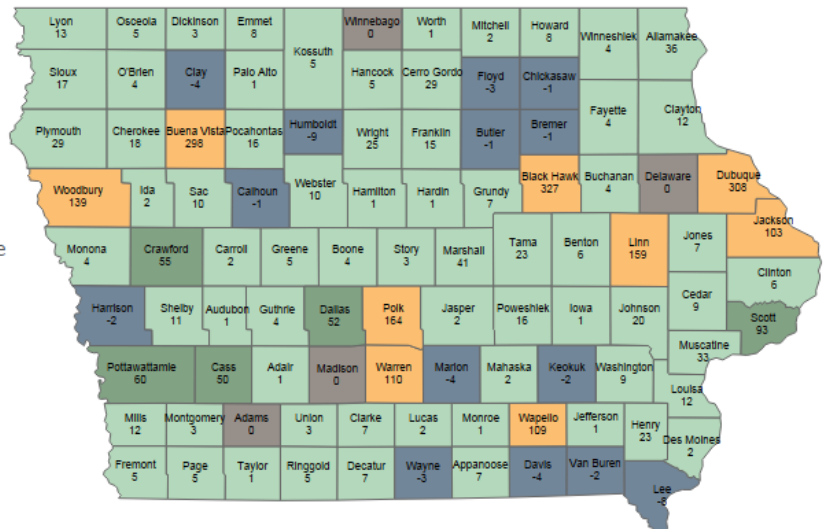

The percentage of Asians in 2016, age 25 and over, who have a bachelor's or higher degree education. Asians have the highest proportion of college graduates of any race or ethnic group in the state. The corresponding rate for all lowans in this age group is 28.4 percent.

82.8%

The percentage of Asians in 2016, age 25 and over, who are high school graduates. The corresponding rate for all lowans is 91.8percent.

29.9%

The percentage of Asians in 2016, age 25 and over, who have a graduate degree (e.g., master's, Ph.D., M.D. or J.D.). The corresponding rate for all adults in the age group is 9.3 percent.

74.6%

The percentage of Native Hawaiian and other Pacific Islanders, age 25 and over in 2016, who are high school graduates.

12.4%

The percentage of Native Hawaiian and other Pacific Islanders, age 25 and over in 2016, who have a bachelor's or higher degree education.

Languages

12,413

The number of people who speak Chinese at home in 2016. Chinese is the most widely spoken Asian language in the state. Also among the most frequently spoken languages are: Vietnamese (5,431), Thai, Lao, or other Tai-Kadai (5,580); Korean (2,549); and Tagalog (2,756).

Age

35.2%

The percentage of the native Hawaiian and other Pacific Islander population that are under 18 in 2016; 3.6 percent are 65 or over.

26.8

The median age of Iowa's native Hawaiian and other Pacific Islander population in 2016.

24.9%

The percentage of people identifying themselves as Asian that are under 18; 5.4 percent are 65 or over.

28.5

The median age of Iowa's Asian population in 2016. The median age for the state of Iowa is 38.0

The number of families with householders who reported their race as Asian in 2016.

The numeric change in families with householders who reported their race as Asian between 2000-2016. This is a 97.0 percent increase for the period.

The median income of households in 2016 whose householders reported their race as Asian. The median household income for all lowans is \$56,247.

\$47,488

The median income of households whose householders reported their race as native Hawaiians and other Pacific Islanders in 2015.

13.9%

The poverty rate in 2016 for those who reported their race as Asian. The poverty rate for those reported their race as native Hawaiians and other Pacific Islander was 32.1% The corresponding rate for Iowa as a whole is 11.8 percent.

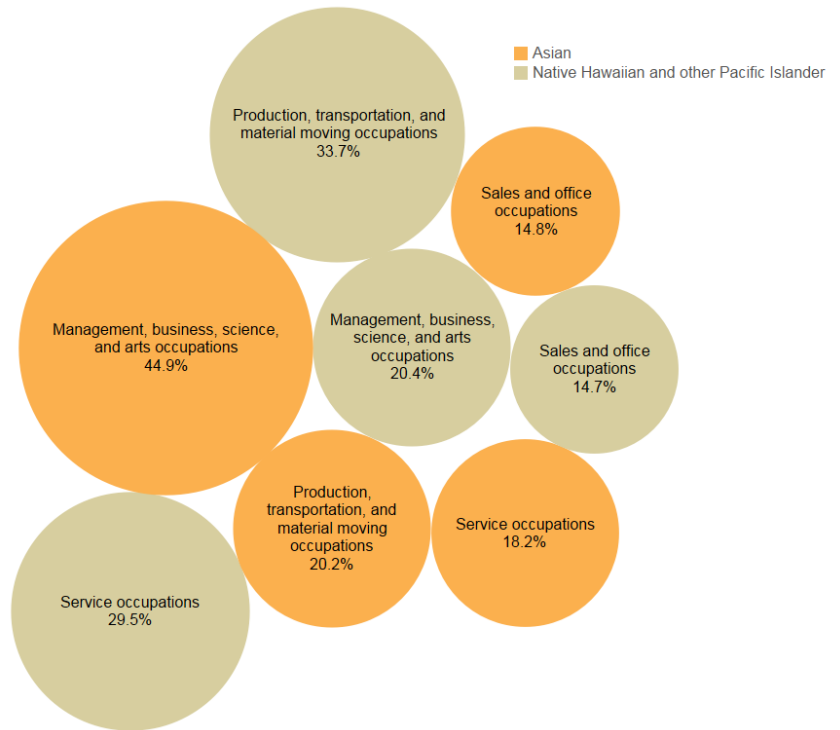
