The 2021 African American population in Iowa. African Americans constitute 4.3% of the state's total population. In 1980, African Americans made up 1.4% of the state's total population.



The African American population in five counties: Polk, Scott, Linn, Black Hawk, and Johnson in 2021. This accounts for 67.2% of the total African American population in lowa.

The percent of the African American population living in Des Moines in 2020. Des Moines has the largest population (25,011) of African Americans in any city in Iowa.
