


Johnson, Iowa

Johnson is one of 99 counties in Iowa. It is part of the Iowa City, IA (MSA). Its 2007 population of 125,454 ranked 5th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2007 Johnson had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$36,453. This PCPI ranked 9th in the state and was 104 percent of the state average, \$34,916, and 94 percent of the national average, \$38,615. The 2007 PCPI reflected an increase of 6.2 percent from 2006. The 2006-2007 state change was 6.6 percent and the national change was 4.9 percent. In 1997 the PCPI of Johnson was \$23,980 and ranked 19th in the state. The 1997-2007 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.3 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.0 percent and for the nation was 4.3 percent.



In 2007 Johnson had a total personal income (TPI) of \$4,573,135*. This TPI ranked 4th in the state and accounted for 4.4 percent of the state total. In 1997 the TPI of Johnson was \$2,554,747* and ranked 5th in the state.

*Note: Total personal income estimates are in thousands of dollars, not adjusted for inflation.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Johnson.
